Information	Consumer Information	In 2024, Oceana launched the “Follow the Fish” movement calling for a revision of the Common Market Organisation Regulation to require consumer information for all fishery and aquaculture products. Oceana published a report analysing product labels in supermarkets across Belgium, France and Spain. Oceana also conducted a poll with citizens from Belgium, France, Spain, and Cyprus. Information + Decision	Hygiene and Sanitary Issues	Under Commission Regulation (EU) 2015/1006, the maximum levels of inorganic arsenic in some foodstuffs were regulated. In 2021, EFSA published a scientific opinion on dietary exposure to inorganic arsenic, which called for a reduction in the exposure. DG SANTE initiated the work to revise the regulation. At the 27 January 2023 meeting, it was agreed, as an action point, that, an item on arsenic would be scheduled. At the 8 June 2023 meeting, there was an exchange of views with the responsible DG SANTE official.
